

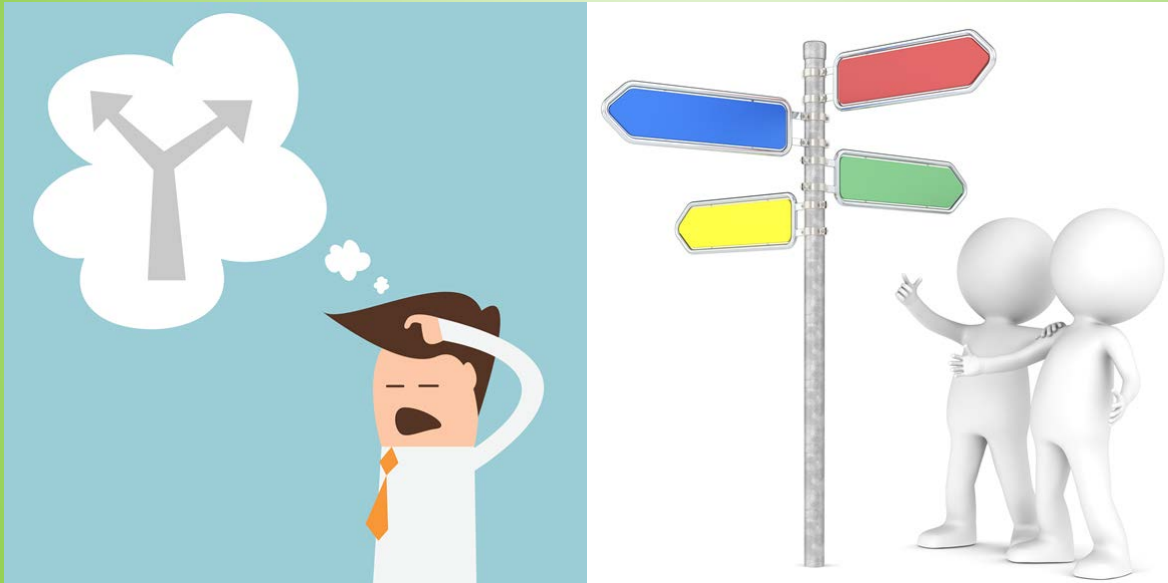

EXCHANGE:

- ▶ AU allocates positions
- ▶ No tuition fees or limited fees
- ▶ Assistance with
 - ▶ application procedure
 - ▶ housing arrangement
 - ▶ Visa requirements

FREEMOVER:

- ▶ You must contact host institution/provider on your own
- ▶ You must organize all practicalities yourself
- ▶ In most cases you need to pay tuition fees

Summer courses

Why attend summer school?
Summer school allows you to experience a foreign study environment, improve your language skills, and earn ECTS points during the summer holiday.
A large number of universities offer short courses during the summer period. A summer course at a foreign university is an exciting alternative for students who do not wish to spend a whole semester abroad.

Summer school study places through AU
Each year, AU is offered tuition free places on summer schools in selected countries (typically Europe, India and China). There is no general deadline, so please check with each university of interest for information on application details, deadlines, pre-requisites etc. by clicking the links below.
The study places are allocated on the basis of the various criteria, among others:
- average mark
- number of years of study
- special requirements under the exchange agreement, e.g. a motivation or a statement
We advertise these positions continually on this website and will update availabilities between January and March for the summer of 2019.

Application deadline
There is no general deadline. Please check below for deadlines under the individual summer schools.

Pre-approval

DO YOU QUALIFY?

- ▶ You must be a full time student at AU
- ▶ You must be an active student
- ▶ You must fulfill specific requirements for the partner universities you apply for

HOW TO APPLY

- ▶ Check application deadline
- ▶ Send email to ic@au.dk which must include:
 - your name and student number
 - Which summer school(s) you wish to apply for
 - transcript of records
 - pre-approval from your study board (but you may apply without)
 - If applying for more summer schools include a prioritized list

ALLOCATION CRITERIA

Criteria of Allocation for summer university positions:

- ▶ Pre-approval
- ▶ GPA
- ▶ Seniority of study
- ▶ Relevant level of study

APPLICATION RESPONSE

Position offer:

- ▶ You will receive a reply to your application shortly after the application deadline

AFTER ALLOCATION

- ▶ The international office will nominate you to the host institution
 - ▶ You will receive application information from the international office
 - ▶ You apply to host university yourself
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- ▶ Please note that AU cannot guarantee your acceptance to the host university or into specific courses. The host university is entitled to singlehandedly decide which students they will admit.

GOING OUT ON YOUR OWN

- ▶ Summer school of your choice
- ▶ Find it – e.g. summerschoolsineurope.eu, Google etc.
- ▶ Apply for pre-approval
- ▶ Pay for it – most schools will charge a tuition fee
- ▶ Apply for Udlandsstipendiet/Scholarship for study abroad
 - ▶ Only if you are a Danish citizen. For other nationalities only in very rare cases:
“It is possible to obtain a special grant (tilskud til undervisningsafgift) towards tuition fee for a very small number of educations, such as Hotel and Tourism educations on post graduate level, plus educations containing equal parts of economics and language studies - and only such combinations, that are not offered in Denmark.” (<http://www.su.dk/english/studies-abroad/>)

UDLANDSSTIPENDIET – FOR TUITION ONLY

- ▶ Apply via SU-kontoret including your pre-approval and letter of acceptance
 - ▶ 44.100 per. 60 ECTS: **5 ECTS= 3.675 DKK** (de fleste fag på HUM og SAM)
 - ▶ 63.300 per. 60 ECTS: **5 ECTS= 5.275 DKK** (enkelte fag på HUM, SAM, NAT og SUN)
 - ▶ 92.500 per. 60 ECTS: **5 ECTS= 7.710 DKK** (de fleste fag på NAT og SUN)
- ▶ Sample prices:
 - ▶ Prague Summer School of Journalism: 8 ECTS, 6.480 DKK (tuition, housing, events etc.)
 - ▶ Summer School Mannheim: 6 ECTS, 1.341 DKK (tuition only)
 - ▶ Loughborough University: 5 ECTS, 16.750 DKK (tuition, housing, food and events)
