
AARHUS UNIVERSITY – SOME FACTS

- 50 % of Master degree programmes are taught in English





REGISTRATION

At the International Centre you will receive:

- Form for CPR application
- Letter of Enrolment
- Application form for your residence certificate (EU)
- Application form from LearnDanish (LærDansk)
- Study card (if you applied correctly)
- Welcome bag (maps, merchandise)
- Student handbook (a LOT of useful information)
- Presentation videos showing the registration process at students.au.dk/en/internationalstudents/au-intro-week







RESIDENCE PERMIT/CERTIFICATE

CENTRAL PERSON REGISTER (CPR)

- Residents in Denmark are required to have a CPR number (personal, unique ID nr)
- Gives a right to a range of services in Denmark: public authorities, health authorities, libraries, banks etc. Contract mobile phone, gym membership
- Issued by the Citizens' Services (Borgerservice) issued after two to three weeks after application



MEDICAL TREATMENT

- After having applied for CPR number at Citizens' Services (Borgerservice), you receive the Yellow National Health Card after a couple of weeks
- Services offered under national health insurance scheme
- Always carry your "yellow card"
- Make sure of health insurance coverage until valid Danish health insurance
- If you need to see a doctor before having obtained CPR nr, contact IC

When applying for CPR, non-EU and Nordic citizens must bring:

- Completed application form "Arriving from foreign countries" (1 page)
- Valid passport/ID card
- 1 copy of passport/ID card (both front and back)
- If married, bring copy of marriage certificate/license

AND

1 copy of Letter of Enrolment

Non-EU citizens must also bring a copy of their residence permit Nordic citizens must also bring documentation for their Nordic personal number



APPLY ON AUGUST 20, 10:00- 13:00 @ Lakeside Lecture Theatres, bldn. 1252

When applying for BOTH residence certificate + CPR, **EU citizens** must bring:

- Completed application form "Application for EU-residence document" (7 pages sign on page 6!)
- Completed application form "Arriving from foreign countries" (1 page)
- 1 passport size photo IMPORTANT! Info about photo shops at IC
- Valid passport/ID card
- 2 copies of passport/ID card (both front and back)
- 1 copy of the blue EU-health insurance card (order in home country)
- If married, bring copy of marriage certificate/license

AND

• 2 copies of Letter of Enrolment



NemID

NemID is a digital key that you need to unlock your personal information on the official websites while you are in Denmark.

- > You will need a NemID to:
- > Open a bank account
- > Change address in Denmark
- > Communicate in general with the authorities
- > Deregistration when you leave Denmark
- > How to get it? Go to the Citizens' Services with your passport and your CPR number and register for one (not possible tomorrow – you need to have CPR number before!).





IMPORTANT

 If change of address: You must report your move to Citizens' Services within 14 days – otherwise you will receive a fine! (with NEM ID)

- > Put your name on your mailbox otherwise you will receive a fine (and you don't get your yellow card).
- > Remember to join the guided tours which you signed up for otherwise please cancel (IC@au.dk)
- Remember the applications, copies and 1 photo for registration tomorrow!
