Det kan derfor ske at du tildeles en anden vejleder, end nogle af dem du har skrevet på din prioriteringsliste.

Premises for the process of prioritizing and assigning Thesis Supervisor

- It is recommended that you engage in dialogue with potential thesis supervisors before submitting your prioritized choices.
- It is recommended that you integrate project-oriented courses (especially internships) with your thesis topic. Perhaps you can collect data for your thesis during your internship at a museum or similar institution?
- It is also recommended that your supervisor for the project-oriented course should be the supervisor for your thesis.
- Thoroughly investigate which instructor (the instructor's research interests and fields) is the best 'match' for your thesis topic.
- Important: There is no guarantee that you will be assigned one of the supervisors included in your priority list! The assignment of a supervisor depends on an overall assessment, which includes teaching staff's workload and their various research interests and fields. It may therefore happen that you end up being assigned a different supervisor than those you have included in your prioritized list.
