# WELCOME TO MOESGAARD!

## About your campus:

As a new student of either Anthropology, Archaeology, Sustainable Heritage Management or Human Security, your main campus will be Moesgaard Campus. Moesgaard is located about 40 min. by bus south of Aarhus City Centre.

Moesgaard is an old manor dating as far back as 1396, previously housing Moesgaard Museum. Today, it is home to students and employees of Aarhus University.



# MAP OF CAMPUS



**The teaching wing** is located in building 4206 (on your left when you arrive from the bus). Here, most of your classes will be taking place.

**The library wing** is located in building 4230 (on your right when you arrive from the bus). During the intro week you can attend a short introductory course to the library. In

the library, a number of reading spots are available for students. Read more about the library below.

Most of the **academic and administrative staff** is located at buildings 4235-36 and 4215 next to the library as well as in the Manor House (4211).

# FACILITIES AT MOESGAARD

**Study Counselling:** At Moesgaard, there are three counsellors available to help you with all problems related to your studies. Whether it is regarding purely academic questions or more personal matters (stress etc.), the counsellors are a good place to start. The counsellors will do their best to help you, or send you in the direction of someone else that can. **Classrooms & the Lecture Hall:** These you will find in building 4206. In these rooms, most of your lectures will be taking place. The Lecture Hall is used for teaching, workshops and other relevant activities such as events hosted by the research programmes. Remember to close windows and doors and to put up your chair when you leave.

**Group rooms:** Moesgaard Library is part of AU Library and the Royal Danish Library. Besides finding the books and articles you need (<http://library.au.dk>), you can also book group rooms online both at Moesgaard and at the main campus. **Kitchen:** In building 4206 there is a small student-kitchen (right next to the Friday Bar area), which can be used by students. In the kitchen you'll find an oven, microwave, fridge, kettle and basic dishes and cups. Remember to clean up after yourself.

**Cafeteria:** Moesgaard cafeteria ("kantinen") is located in building 4204. It is open Monday- Thursday 8:00-14:00, and Friday 8:00-13:30. Here, you can buy food, snacks and drinks. You can pay with VISA-card, Danish Dankort, MobilePay and cash.

**Friday Bar:** Almost every week, there is a Friday Bar event at Moesgaard. The bar room is located in building 4206, at **The Balle Lounge**, and all are welcome to join! Usually, the bar is hosted either by the Anthropological Friday Bar or the Archaeological Friday Bar, and both organizations are often looking for new members.

**The museum:** As a student at Moesgaard, you have free access to Moesgaard Museum (MoMu). Remember to bring your Student ID card (see below) and your certificate of enrolment (to be retrieved at [mit.au.dk](http://mit.au.dk) → Student Self Service). Like most museums in Denmark, MoMu is closed on Mondays.



# IT SYSTEMS ETC.

**Mit.au.dk, Student Self Service, Blackboard:** the online portals you will be needing during your studies at AU. This is where you register for elective courses, exams and internships, get your Student ID card, etc. An introduction will be given during the introduction week.

**Student ID card:** This card will give you access to buildings around AU. You have to order it at: <http://studerende.au.dk/en/studentid/>

**Student ID number & AU ID:** As a student at AU, you have two types of identification numbers. The one you will use most is your **student ID number**. This number was given to you when you were enrolled. The number is also visible at your student ID card. You need your second number - your called **AU ID** - when you log on to Eduroam. To find yours, log on to **mit.au.dk**.

**Wifi:** You need to download the program "Eduroam". See guide at: <http://eduroam.au.dk/en/>

**Print and copy:** There are two printers and copy machines to be used by students at Moesgaard: in building 4205, copy room 113A, and in building 4230, copy room 117. To print and copy, you need to create a MyPrint-profile at <http://library.au.dk/en/facilities/myprint-print-and-copy/>

**Free Microsoft Office 365:** As a student at AU, you have free access to Microsoft Office 365. More info at: <http://studerende.au.dk/en/selfservice/discount-on-software/>
