MINUTES

1. Approval of agenda and follow up on the minutes from last meeting (decision)

The agenda was approved and there was no follow-up on the minutes from the last meeting.

2. Presentation of the work and responsibilities of the UN (orientation) (11:05-11:20)

Jakob Steensig gave the UN a presentation of the responsibilities of the UN. Furthermore, Head of Department Joshua Skewes informed that every month he has meetings only with students from the degree programmes at the department (studentforum).

3. Establishment of the new degree programme board – as of 1 February 2024 (decision) (11:20-11:30)

According to the rules of procedure, the UN must be established no later than at the first meeting after a new election.

The chair is elected from among the members of the academic staff and the deputy chair from among students elected to the board of studies as either representatives or alternates.

In connection with the establishment, the distribution is decided by UN members and alternates. The distribution can be based on the number of votes (order of candidates in uncontested elections) or other agreements.



The school has specified the number of members of each degree programme board. On the UN for LICS, there are 3 members of the academic staff and 3 students. Members of the board of studies must be members of the UN.

5. Orientation of approved plan of actions and minutes from the evaluation meeting for Linguistics (orientation) (11.50-12.00)

The UN is informed of the approved plan of actions for BA and MA in Linguistics and the minutes from the evaluation meeting.

Head of department informed that the action plans are updated based on the evaluation meeting. One of the actions which was added was to have a student representative to recruit on Gymnasiums due to a smaller decrease in studentapplicants for the BA Linguistics. For the MA degree programme one of the discussions was that student were not introduced to project management, therefor there will be implemented teaching about project management, so the student develops these skills.

6. Orientation of degree programmes which are to be evaluated (orientation) (12.00-12.10)

Head of department informed about the degree programmes which, according to the rotation plan, are to be evaluated this year. For the department of LICS the BA and MA in Cognitive Science are to be evaluated following standard track. The evaluation report will be written by Josh Skewes with input from Lau Andersen as department coordinator. The degree programmes are doing well and the



main focus in the evaluation will be actions the department are already working on such as: coherence between methods and topic areas at the BA programme. Side 4/5

7. Orientation of academic regulations/changes to academic regulations following a review by the Dean's Office to take effect on 1 September the current year (orientation) (12.10-12.20)

The vice-dean for education has reviewed the proposals received for new academic regulations and changes to academic regulations.

On this basis, the UN was informed about academic regulations and changes to academic regulations that will take effect on 1 September the current year. Approved changes to the academic regulations take effect on 1 September. Autumn courses are published in the course catalogue on 1 April.

The following changes were approved:

- BSc Cognitive Science BA-project change in description of individualization (appendix 7.1).
- BA Linguistics section 2.1 removal of demand for 75% regulation participation (appendix 7.2)
- MA Linguistics Typology clarification of length of assignments (appendix 7.3)

The following changes were not approved:

- BA supplementary in Cultural Data Science – Language analytics – change in exam form (appendix 7.4)

Head of department informed that the teachers for the specific courses have been involved and overall, the changes are to ease the exams.

8. News from Head of Department (Orientation/discussion)

Head of department informed that there is a job application out. The new (student) head tutors have been hired for both BA Cognitive Science and Linguistics. Head tutors for the MA programmes are not hired yet and there may be need for help from the degree programme coordinator for the recruitment.

9. Issues for upcoming meetings

10. AOB

There was a discussion about "digital exam" and sudden changes of exam dates, where teachers were not informed.

Students informed that the rules about formalities regarding the exams always confuse the students during the exam period. The student guidance informs about the formalities



at the beginning of the 1st semester, but maybe they should mention it continuously. Teachers at the meeting informed that the rules about formalities are stated in the academic regulation or at the study portal – student and staff members are always encouraged to read the academic regulations in connection with the exams.
