Annual status review 2022 – Part 1 (item for discussion) (14.20- 14.40)	- Case Competition on tourism  The head of department gave a status of last year's plans of actions for degree programmes, with input from members of the degree programme board. The head of the department also gave a status on the actions plans for the teaching environments.	

4.	Danish Student Survey 2021 (SMU) (item for discussion) (14.40- 15.00)	On this basis, the degree programme board discussed which actions need to be continued including the actions in regards to drop out, visibility of the programmes, study environment and study intensity.  In regards to study intensity the UN discussed if it would be possible to have a presentation from eg. CED on possible ideas or inspiration for improving the study intensity in the programmes. Uwe will look into this. Study intensity will be a focus in this round of discussing action plans.  The UN discussed the survey, which seems to still be affected by corona although the numbers are not as bad as could be expected.  The UN agreed that the survey is an indicator for several important issues that need to be discussed:  - Social environment - especially for the international students, who need to be better included in the department. An idea could be to take them to different social activities like the bars and other events. This might be more strongly connected to the programmes, for the students to be more committed to participate in the events. The issue could also be discussed with the Fagudvalg for further ideas.	
5.	Danish Student Survey, Graduates (item for discussion) (15.00- 15.20)	<ul> <li>The UN discussed the results of the 2021 Danish Student Survey, Graduates 1-2 years after graduation.</li> <li>The degree programme board pointed out:</li> <li>The extent in which the degree programme prepare the graduates for their jobs</li> <li>The connection between the competences acquired through their degree programme and the competences applied in their job</li> <li>The most important elements for finding a job: internship, networking and staying abroad. Activities in the alumni network should be discussed in the UN to improve employability. Other events might also be used in this regards like the autumn lecture, career events in the department and the likes.</li> </ul>	

		It is important to address to the students, that the events are made specifically for students at Global Studies and underline how they can use the events. This can also be done by inviting alumni into the teaching to make it more relevant to the students.  This will be taken up at a meeting in the August/September. Uwe will ask other Dept/UN how they work with this.
