Guidelines for financial support for student activities

Department of Economics and Business Economics

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Department of Economics and Business Economics wishes to strengthen the study environment for the department's students through financial support for student activities. These guidelines contain an overview of associations eligible, which purposes and activities the department wants to support, and which procedures must be followed when applying for these.

Financial support for operations

All education-specific student associations (see page 3) can apply for a fixed grant each academic year for the general operation of the association. The amount is agreed on individually with the associations.

Every year, the association must submit a short application containing a description of the activities/events that have been held the previous academic year, activities/events planned for the coming academic year, number of members, who sits on the board of directors, contact information, as well as (if possible) previously agreed on amount of financial support. Application is made by filling out the relevant application form on the relevant study portal. **The deadline is February 1.**

Financial support for study trips

Financial support is granted for academically relevant study trips arranged by student associations affiliated with the department or for study trips arranged by a lecturer as an extension of a course. Application takes place by filling out the relevant application form on the relevant study portal.

Study trips must generally take place at times, when it does not conflict with teaching. The purpose of the study trips must be for the students to gain new perspectives on their studies, e.g., by visiting companies or other universities. It is not possible to apply for support for trips in connection with thesis writing.

Rates:

- Overseas: DKK 800 per student
- Europe: DKK 400 per student
- Zealand (Sjælland): DKK 200 per student
- The rest of Denmark and one-day trips are assessed individually (max. DKK 150 per student)

Financial support for recurring activities

Upon application, financial support is granted annually for:

Financial support for other activities

Financial support may be given for events that have academic content and are not just social events.

Procedure

All applications to Department of Economics and Business Economics must be submitted **via the application forms**. These can be found on the study portals:

All applications must include budget, program, expected number of participants, as well as information on whether grants are provided by external partners. As mentioned, the application is made by filling out the relevant application form on the relevant study portal, which is then sent to the department at studentactivities@econ.au.dk.

The department expects the association to seek other funds prior to the application for departmental support, and evidence of either commitment or rejection of this should be attached to the application to the Department of Economics and Business Economics.
