Full academic programme	<p>Undergraduate level: A bachelor's programme will consist of 120 points per academic year. A three-year degree involves 360 points of study, while a four-year degree involves 480 points.</p> <p>Graduate level: A master's degree will consist of 120 points per academic year. Duration is usually two or three semesters of full-time study.</p> <p>Both levels: The standard course load for is 50-60 points per semester or 100-120 points per year. Most courses are weighted 15 points and students generally take four courses per semester.</p>
