Academic calendar	<p>Boston University operates on a semester basis. Full academic program	<p><b>Undergraduate level:</b>  To complete a four-year bachelor programme and to obtain a bachelor’s degree, students must complete 128 credits and 32 courses. Undergraduate students generally proceed toward completion of their degree at the rate of 16–18 credits per semester. Most courses carry 4 credits and are full semester courses.</p> <p>Full workload per semester is 16 credits.</p> <p><b>Graduate level:</b>  Candidates for the master’s degree are required to complete a minimum of eight graduate-level semester courses (32 credits) or the equivalent, although specific degree programs may require more. The program shall be completed within three years after the first registration for study leading to the master’s degree. Normally, no more than four courses (16 credits) may be taken concurrently. Most courses carry 4 credits and are full semester courses.</p> <p>Full workload per semester is 16 credits.</p>

Course level	<p>All courses are assigned a college and departmental code and a three-digit course number. For example, CAS BI 325 means that the course is offered in the College of Arts &amp; Sciences (CAS), by the Biology Department (BI). The course number 325 indicates it is an advanced undergraduate course.</p> <p>100-199      General undergraduate  200-299      Intermediate undergraduate  300-499      Advanced undergraduate  500-699      Advanced undergraduate and/or graduate level  700-799      General graduate  800-899      Advanced graduate  900-999      Graduate directed study and research</p>
Recommendation	<p>It is possible to combine courses from undergraduate level and graduate level.</p> <p><b>Undergraduate and graduate level:</b>  16 credit units will be transferred with 30 ECTS.</p>
ECTS equivalency	<p><b>Undergraduate and graduate level:</b>  4 credits = 7,5 ECTS</p>
