Full academic program	<p>Undergraduate level: Students must complete 120 credits to achieve a BSc degree which would equate to students taking 5 courses (3 credits) per semester for a total of 4 years. Thirty credit hours per academic year are regarded as constituting a normal workload for a student.</p> <p>Graduate level: There is no one standard number of credits or courses students must take to complete a MSc degree. All degrees are made up of varying numbers of courses.</p>

A full year (X/Y) course is normally worth one full credit (6 credit hours).</p> <p>Credit Hours: One full credit is equal to six credit hours and one half credit is equal to 3 credit hours.</p>
Recommendation	<p>It is possible to combine courses from undergraduate level and graduate level. Undergraduate courses (3 credits) will count as 6 ECTS and graduate courses (3 credits) count as 8 ECTS.</p> <p>Undergraduate level: 4 courses per semester for Fall or Winter semester (3 credit hours per course) will be transferred with 25 ECTS.</p> <p>5 courses (4 in Fall or Winter and 1 course in Summer) or (5 in Fall or Winter) will be transferred with 30 ECTS.</p> <p>Graduate level 3 courses (9 credit units) will be transferred with 25 ECTS.</p> <p>4 courses will be transferred with 30 ECTS.</p>
ECTS equivalency	<p>Undergraduate level: 15 credits = 30 ECTS 3 credits = 6 ECTS</p> <p>Graduate level: 12 credits = 30 ECTS 3 credits = 8 ECTS</p>
