Academic calendar	<p>Oklahoma State University operates on a semester basis – each 16 weeks.</p> <p>Fall term: Early September to Early December Spring term: Mid-January to Early May</p> <p>https://registrar.okstate.edu/Academic-Calendar</p>
Full academic program	<p>Undergraduate: An undergraduate degree is typically 4 years and 120 credits. An academic year is 2 semesters. Full academic workload per semester is 15 credits.</p> <p>Graduate: A graduate degree includes the completion of 30 semester credit hours. This program normally takes maximum 2 years to complete. Graduate students typically take six or nine credit hours during the Fall and Spring semesters and three credit hours during the Summer. Normal academic workload per semester is 9 credits.</p>

Course level	<p>1000-2000: undergraduate courses 3000-4000: undergraduate and graduate courses* 5000-6000: graduate level</p> <p>Course Subject. The course subject code is comprised of no more than five characters representing the home department or course subject area.</p> <p>Course Number. All courses are identified by numbers composed of four digits. The first digit indicates the class year in which the subject is ordinarily taken, the second and third digits identify the course within the field and the last digit identifies the number of semester credit hours the course carries, e.g. PHYS 5453.</p> <p>*Courses numbered 3000 and 4000 may be taken for graduate credit if the course is approved for credit at the graduate level. Courses that are identified by an asterisk next to the course number in the Catalog are approved for graduate level students. A student must perform additional assignments at an intellectual level commensurate with graduate level work as specified in the course syllabus to earn graduate credit for such a class., http://registrar.okstate.edu/node/408</p>
Recommendation	It is possible to combine courses from undergraduate level and graduate level. Undergraduate courses (3 credits) will count as 6

	<p>ECTS and graduate courses (3 credits) count as 10 ECTS.</p> <p>Undergraduate: 5 courses (each 3 credits) per term will be transferred with 30 ECTS.</p> <p>Graduate: 3 graduate courses of 3 credits per term will be transferred with 30 ECTS.</p>
ECTS equivalency	<p>Undergraduate: 15 credits = 30 ECTS 3 credits = 6 ECTS</p> <p>Graduate: 12 credits = 30 ECTS 3 credits = 10 ECTS</p>
