Full academic programme	<p>Undergraduate level: Most bachelor degrees require 360 credits. These will be completed over three years, studying full time. There are a few bachelor degrees that require 480 credits and are normally completed over four years of full-time study (e.g. engineering). Students are required to take not less than 120 per year or not less than 60 points per semester. Each course is typically worth 15 credits.</p> <p>Graduate level: Master degree programmes typically require 240-credits in total. Part one, which is the first year, consists of courses and is normally studied full-time over two semesters which means that students are required to take 60 points per semester. Each course is typically worth 15 credits. Part two is dissertation and is completed full-time in one to two years.</p>

Course level	<p>Each course has a code of four letters and three numbers. The letters show the subject and the numbers show the level.</p> <p>For example, MATH101 is a Mathematics course at 100 level and ENGL201 is an English course at 200 level.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 000-level range is used for pre-degree preparatory programme courses • 100-level courses are for first year courses • 200-level and 300-level courses represent advanced-level undergraduate courses • 400, 500 and 600-level are postgraduate, honours and master's level courses • 700-level range is used for PhDs <p><u>Undergraduate courses in Science</u> 300 level courses are the most advanced undergraduate courses. 400 level courses are graduate courses and undergraduate exchange students are <u>not</u> eligible to take 400 level courses, unless students have been granted admission to a Postgraduate Certificate of Proficiency.</p> <p><u>Undergraduate courses in Engineering</u> 400 level courses are classed as undergraduate courses. Exchange students may be permitted to take 400 level courses if</p>

	they have the necessary pre-requisites and the approval of the relevant department.
Recommendation	Undergraduate and graduate level: 4 courses of each 15 credits will be transferred with 30 ECTS
ECTS equivalency	Undergraduate and graduate level: 60 credits = 30 ECTS
