Full academic program	<p><b>Undergraduate level:</b> Most bachelor degrees are three years (e.g. Business, Science), but some are four (e.g. Engineering, Social Work).</p> <p>Students enrolled in the single degree must complete a minimum of 144 units of credit during three years, or 48 units of credit per year or 24 units of credit per semester.</p> <p>Most courses are worth 6 units of credit.</p> <p><b>Graduate level:</b> Master degrees are between one and two years.</p> <p>Students must complete a minimum of 24 units of credit per semester.</p> <p>Most courses are worth 6 units of credit.</p>

Course level	<p>UNSW courses codes are made up of a four-character alphabetic prefix, identifying the School or unit administering the course, and a four-digit numeric suffix e.g. ECON1101 - Microeconomics 1.</p> <p>Undergraduate courses are usually classified by Level e.g. Level 1 courses are usually undertaken in the first stage of a program, Level 2 in the second stage etc. In many cases the first digit of the four-digit numeric suffix of the course code indicates the level of the course e.g. ECON1101 is a Level 1 course whereas MARK3054 is a Level 3 course, usually undertaken in stage 3.</p>
Recommendation	<p><b>Undergraduate and graduate level:</b> 4 courses (each 6 credit units) per semester will be transferred with 30 ECTS.</p>
ECTS equivalency	<p><b>Undergraduate and graduate level:</b> 24 units = 30 ECTS 1 units = 1,25 ECTS</p>
