Full academic program	<p>Undergraduate level: An undergraduate degree is either three or four years of studies and, respectively, 90 or 120 credits in total.</p> <p>The workload at the University of Ottawa for one academic year corresponds to 30 credits. The workload for one semester is equal to 15 credits.</p> <p>One regular course is typically 3 credit units.</p> <p>Graduate level: The requirements of master degree programmes are usually fulfilled within two years.</p> <p>There is no one standard number of courses students must take per semester or during their entire degree. All degrees are made up of varying numbers of courses.</p> <p>One regular course is 3 credit units. It is not possible to register to more than 3 courses per semester at the master's level. In addition to the course hours, students are asked to complete additional readings, projects, and written assignments throughout the semester.</p>

Course level	<p>The first number tells you the year of study: 1000-level: first-year courses 2000-level: second-year courses (and so on).</p> <p>The second number tells you the language of instruction: Courses taught in English are numbered 1 through 4 (for example, CRM1301). Courses taught in French are numbered 5 through 8 (for example, CRM1701). Bilingual courses or courses taught in a language other than English or French are numbered with 0 or 9 (for example ESP1991 — course offered in Spanish).</p>

	The last two numbers are assigned by the University to create a unique code for each course offered.
Recommendation	<p>Undergraduate level: 5 courses of 3 credits per semester will be transferred with 30 ECTS.</p> <p>Graduate level: 3 courses of 3 credits per semester will be transferred with 30 ECTS.</p>
ECTS equivalency	<p>Undergraduate level: 15 credits = 30 ECTS 3 credit = 6 ECTS</p> <p>Graduate level: 9 credits = 30 ECTS 3 credits = 10 ECTS</p>
