Academic calendar	<p>Winter session First term: September – end December Second term: Beginning January – end April Summer Session: May - August</p>
Full academic programme	<p>A full-year course through the full Winter Session from September to April normally has a value of 3 units. A half-year course from September to December or from January to April normally has a value of 1.5 units.</p> <p>Undergraduate level At UVic, it normally takes 4 years to complete if you are studying as a full time student (4 years of classes from September - December and January - April). This typically means that you are registered in 5 courses per term, as you will need a minimum of 60 units to graduate with a UVic bachelor's degree.</p> <p>Graduate level M.Sc. degrees are typically 2-2,5 years in length and students are required to obtain 15 units to graduate.</p> <p>Graduate students generally take just 3-4 courses per term, rather than the normal 4 or 5 courses for undergraduates. In general, these graduate level courses require considerably more work than the normal undergraduate courses.</p>
