Full academic program	<p>Undergraduate level: Bachelor's degrees are 3 years (without honours).</p> <p>Students must complete a minimum of 144 credits during 3 years or 24 credits per semester. Most courses are worth 6 units of credit.</p> <p>Graduate level: Master's degrees are typically either 1 year (research) and 48 credits or 2 years (coursework and dissertation) and 96 credits.</p> <p>A standard full workload is 24 points per semester.</p> <p>Most units are worth 6 points.</p>

Course level	<p>You can use the online Handbook to browse through the units offered at UWA.</p> <p>All units will consist of four letters detailing the discipline of the unit (such as ECON for economics, PSYC for Psychology) and four numbers.</p> <p>Units with numbers beginning from 1 to 4 are generally undergraduate units. A code beginning with 1 represents first year level studies, 2 represents second year level studies and so on.</p> <p>Please note that some units coded 3xxx and 4xxx are common to both postgraduate and undergraduate programs and are marked UG (Undergraduate) and PG (Postgraduate) in the handbook.</p> <p>Units with numbers beginning with 5 and above are postgraduate level.</p>
Recommendation	<p>Undergraduate and graduate level: 4 courses (each 6 credits) per semester will be transferred with 30 ECTS.</p>
ECTS equivalency	<p>Undergraduate and graduate level: 24 credits = 30 ECTS 6 credits = 7,5 ECTS</p>
